Wray Village Parking

We all know that parking has been, and probably always will be, a key problem for villagers. Medieval settlements just weren't planned with cars in mind, and people always want to park as near to their front doors as possible! So there are limits to how far the Parish Council can help, but we have recently been reviewing all of the options ...

For those new to the village, we thought it might be worthwhile mentioning that the parking provided at the tea-rooms is actually also village parking. It can be used by villagers and their visitors, and for event parking, at any time. In addition the Parish Council owns a small plot of land on Main Street, at Smithy Brow between Roeburn View and Roeburn House, which is available on a first-come-first-served basis (for *short-term* parking only).

We are also about to create some extra parking space at the other end of the village. These will be on the Parish Council land accessed by the ginnel connecting the Home Farm Close road to Wennington Road, behind the playing field wall. We hope that this will help resolve parking problems here, where the road traffic moves fastest. If you have any other ideas that might help, please let us know as parking is something we always keep under review.

Finally, in response to some recent complaints, can we please remind residents at the far end of Main Street not to park so far up the pavement that people with prams or in wheelchairs are unable to use it; and also not to park in the former bus lay-by so that it can be used as a passing place in this traffic jam hot-spot! Thank you.

Wray Flood Anniversary: Memories and Impacts

Tuesday the 8th August this year will be the 50th anniversary of the Wray flood disaster. To mark the day the Parish Council-sponsored flood exhibition, with its photos, contemporary newspaper reports and documents, will be set up in the Institute and open from 10am to 8pm. TV footage from the time and interview recordings will be there too, along with a display from Wray School of the children's impressions of the flood. Refreshments will be available from 3pm to 5pm – the time when the wall of water came down into Wray, a moment we can remember together. Please drop in sometime that day and add your thoughts and memories to the mix.

Flood damage to buildings and the communities can be seen at once, but it takes much longer for damage to the environment to become apparent. The Parish Council supported the bid for a special event focussing on these wider impacts to tie in with the 50th anniversary (see page 2), which promises to add a new perspective to what happened 50 years ago, and be a lot of fun. Fingers crossed for fine weather and hope to see you there too!

It is advised that everyone over 65 has a flu vaccination **and anyone** who suffers from any of the following conditions: Heart Disease, COPD, Diabetes, Asthma (on daily treatment), Obesity, Chronic Kidney Disease, Chronic liver Disease, **plus** Pregnant Women, at risk children and all children born between 1/9/2013 and 31/8/2015.

If you are unsure whether you are entitled to have a flu vaccination please phone the surgery on Bentham 015242 61202.

If you miss your vaccination please inform reception. You can have your vaccination any time over the winter period but the sooner the better.

Important news about this year's flu vaccination campaign

Influenza is a highly infectious respiratory illness which is extremely debilitating and can cause death, particularly in at risk groups. That is why it is so important for those at risk to have the annual vaccination to protect themselves and to lessen the possibility of passing the virus on to others.

This year there has been a major development in the nature of the flu vaccination. There are different types of flu virus. People who get flu mainly get it from either one of 2 strains of A type virus or one of two strains of B type virus. In previous years the formulation of vaccine has protected against the 2 most common A types but only one of the B type. This is known as a trivalent vaccine. The World Health Organisation (WHO) has had to predict which type of B strain will be the most common in the coming year. **SOMETIMES THEY HAVE GOT IT WRONG!** This year, Bentham Medical Practice has procured Quadrivalent vaccine.

This protects against the two main A strains **AND** the two main B strains. Not all providers of the vaccine will have this new formulation. Many will have the old trivalent type. Having this vaccination will give you 25% less protection against influenza. We will be beginning our vaccination campaign at the beginning of October and there will be plenty of advance information on when and where the clinics will be held. If you do decide to get your vaccination elsewhere make sure that the provider has the new type of vaccine.

Chairman Bob McGachie has submitted our bid to take the pool into community ownership but now we must wait upon Council deliberations - probably about two months.

The pool is currently 'mothballed' but given the green light and with funding in place could be very quickly brought back into use.

We are promised by the ruling Conservative County Councillors that nothing will happen until our application has been processed and negotiations concluded.

We are of course chasing this but in the meantime we continue to seek share pledges to demonstrate strength of feeling and support throughout the valley. That apart, general fundraising activities continue - thank you for all your help to save this essential Lune Valley asset for all our families.
