Lowgill Defibrillator

Lowgill Village now has a Public Access defibrillator donated by the British Heart Foundation. It is at Tatham Fells Primary School in Lowgill, up the front steps attached to the wall (it is not very obvious from the road). The gates to the School are never locked. Mobile phone reception is good. To utilise the defibrillator a 999 call should be made. You will then be given full instructions by the operator as to how to open the box and then how to use the equipment which can be transported to the patient. The 999 call will also alert an ambulance to attend.

- * Anyone can use an AED (automated external Defibrillator)
- * It is easy to use. Just follow the instructions.
- * It is for use on an unconscious adult or child who is not breathing normally.

There are also 2 defibrillators in Wray one is mounted on the outside wall facing the road on the Bus Shelter at the Flood Garden, the other on the right hand front wall of Wray Institute. There is also a defibrillator on the front of the Victoria Institute in Low Bentham.

There will be two Saturday morning clinics between 9.00am and 12.00 noon on 7th and 21st October. No appointment necessary, just turn up and check in at reception.

There will also be evening clinics at Bentham on Wednesday 4th, Tuesday 10th and Wednesday 25th October. **By appointment only.**

Ingleton Surgery. Monday, Tuesday & Thursday from 2nd to 26th October. 10.00am to 12.00noon. No appointment necessary. Just turn up and book in at reception.

It is advised that everyone over 65 has a flu vaccination **and anyone** who suffers from any of the following conditions: Heart Disease, COPD, Diabetes, Asthma (on daily treatment), Obesity, Chronic Kidney Disease, Chronic liver Disease, **plus** Pregnant Women, at risk children and all children born between 1/9/2013 and 31/8/2015.

If you are unsure whether you are entitled to have a flu vaccination please phone the surgery on Bentham 015242 61202.

If you miss your vaccination please inform reception. You can have your vaccination any time over the winter period but the sooner the better.

If you are aged 65 or over (or will be 65 before 31/03/2018) or fall into any of the 'at risk' groups, please make a note of the dates/times as individual letters will not be sent to patients.

Healthy people under 65 years old do not need to be vaccinated.

This year we have ordered the quadrivalent flu vaccine in place of the trivalent. This gives added protection as it covers both the A strains as well as the 2 B strains whereas the trivalent used in previous years only covers one of the B strains.

Wray Institute

Life Saving Defibrillators

Wray Village Institute and Wray Fair Committee provides the community with life-saving defibrillator equipment.

The North West Ambulance Service have been working closely with the Village of Wray to place 2 public access defibrillators into the community to ensure there is a defibrillator resource in the event of sudden cardiac arrest.

The AEDS are placed at:

1. The right hand front wall of the Institute
2. The outside wall of the bus stop on the Flood Garden facing the road.

Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) are designed to be used by the non-trained user; guiding the user on how to place the pads and carry out CPR, and only delivering a shock to the casualty's heart should it be absolutely necessary. Using a defibrillator prior to ambulance arrival when a casualty suffers a cardiac arrest can increase the casualty's chance of survival by 4 times the normal survival rate.

A cardiac arrest is the worst medical emergency; the hearts natural rhythm is disrupted causing an arrhythmia preventing the heart from beating normally and stopping the oxygenated blood reaching the vital organs. Chest compressions (CPR) will ensure the blood supply to remain around the body however the defibrillator will shock the heart back into its natural rhythm to regain the heart's natural heartbeat.

The defibrillators are housed securely in yellow metal cabinets externally, meaning they can be accessed and available 24 hours a day. The AEDs may only be accessed by dialling 999 and following the emergency medical dispatcher's advice and instruction, and will only be advised of its use when necessary.

Cheryl Pickstock, Paramedic and chain of survival lead for the North West Ambulance Service said “as part of delivering excellent care to a patient, the community resuscitation team aim to improve the number of life-saving defibrillators across the North West by liaising with the community and assisting them in making their community safe. Defibrillators are a fantastic piece of kit that saves lives every day when a sudden cardiac

arrest occurs - without them we wouldn't see so many people survive. It's great that we have been able to work with this community in placing the two AED resources around the village and hope to work with more communities in the future.”

In addition all residents and parishioners are most cordially invited to join us in fellowship at this joyful event which is the culmination of nearly three years of work by members of the congregation and our local contractors.

During this period much has been achieved which not only enhances the experience of worshipping congregations but has transformed the church building into one of the best community facilities in the Lune Valley. The whole building is now fresh, well lit, supported by sound, spacious for sitting and moving about in and with the comforts provided by kitchen and toilet. And yes, it is also warm!

We are pleased to acknowledge the wonderful work done by our local contractors. The list of works includes external pointing to weatherproof the western gable and bell turret (Richard Kenyon), re-plastering significant areas of the interior walls, fixing new supports to purlins in the roof, adjustments to the level of the aisle with newly flagged flooring and much else (Richard Denby), re-ordering the pews in nave, and removal of choir stalls and new wood flooring to provide more free space for flexible use, installation of a kitchen and a disabled compliant WC cubicle with toddler changing facilities and much new oak woodwork (Tony and Sheila Sedgwick), removal of the Victorian heating pipes and their replacement with modern radiators, and WC and kitchen plumbing (R & M Wheildon of Bentham), complete redecoration (Jonathan Buss), new lighting throughout and other electrical installations and renewals, (Andrew Cross of Harrison and Cross of Settle), and installation of a sound system (Audioworks of Bentham). Our general architect was Tony Gilmore of Morecambe, and Mike Overton of Ilkley for the specialist lighting.

We look forward to seeing as many of you as possible on 5th October. Refreshments will be served in church afterwards.
