Flood Garden Flags

The Parish Council have received complaints recently regarding the slippery state of flagstones in the Flood Gardens, particularly around the trees and the potential danger this poses for those accessing the area.

Over time various suggestions have been made on how we might cope with this on-going problem.

- * Pressure cleaning the area on a regular basis
- * Using chemicals to treat the surface of the flags
- * Taking up some flags and laying a connecting gravel pathway

Unfortunately some of the solutions create problems of their own. Pressure cleaning requires water and a power supply and using chemicals near the river could contaminate the water.

However, we do need to come up with a solution and I would be grateful for any ideas, which might help.
