B4RN NEWSLETTER

The B4RN management team met in October to discuss how the project has progressed.

Registration - the additional efforts of the various "village champions" were now achieving good results. Current registrations are 443 against our target of 662 (see beanstalk on www.b4rn.org.uk for updates)

Based on the positive reaction from the community, we agreed that the project should now move to the funding stage. Working teams have been organised to bring together the various items still required to allow a shared prospectus to be finalised, printed and sent to all parties. This is a major step forward.

Please continue to encourage friends and family to register on the site www.b4rn.org.uk as the routes the fibre will take are being tweaked to take in all the people who want a service. If you aren't on the map you may get left until the later stages, so make sure your neighbours all make their mark on the fibremap by registering. Don't leave it until the last minute, as many areas are already getting covered with pins and will be amongst the first to get connections.

You do not have to pay any money upfront, payment is only due once you get a connection. You do not have to buy shares to get a connection, but the share issue is a great investment as there is 30% tax back on them if you are a taxpayer. Update on the PRG

The Patient Participation Group is now the Patient Representative Group (PRG). This new name feels more appropriate to the group's role.

Work is continuing, supported by the Looking Well, to design and make two noticeboards for the surgeries in Bentham and Ingleton. These noticeboards will be eye-catching and interactive giving information.

A questionnaire will be distributed shortly, with a letter of explanation, to approx. 10% of surgery patients picked at random, to evaluate the service you experience. If you receive one it will be greatly appreciated if you could complete and return it in the S.A.E.

Jonathan Scott (Surgery Practice Manager) and Dr Emma Harding told the PRG they had attended a meeting recently with South Cumbria commissioning group to discuss the Bentham practice joining the Cumbrian group, as it was felt to have more in common with our rural position and health needs with Cumbria. Local existing service provision will not change unfortunately North Yorkshire and York PCT is reluctant to let us move. A local petition supporting our move to Cumbria will be in local shops, health centres etc. so please sign if you agree. As a PRG we are writing to our local MPs, PCTs and the Regional Health Authority and will feedback information through our local papers.
