## **Neighbourhood Planning... or “The Wray Forward”?**

*The Wray Forward*: geddit? Yes, it's a lame pun but honestly, it's a huge improvement on my other ideas for a catchy title....

So what's this all about? Many of us attended a meeting in the Institute in July to find out more/express our opinions on some proposed housing development in Wray. At that meeting we were invited to indicate if we would like to form a “Neighbourhood Planning” group. Well, some of us did and we'd like to tell you what we've been up to since.

**Neighbourhood Planning? What's that?** This is the term used when a group produces a plan for how they would like their area to develop over the next few years.

**What's the point? Will it make a difference?** Yes! New legislation gives this plan real teeth. Any proposed development **MUST** be in keeping with this plan. Development cannot be imposed on a area if it contravenes the Neighbourhood Plan.

**What goes into the Plan?** Our plan should reflect and explain what is special about our area and also how we want to protect and develop it in the future to make sure it stays special.

**Who decides what goes into the plan?** Everybody in the area! We want to hear your views and ideas. The group will be carrying out surveys and talking to groups to find out your opinions and drafting a plan based on what you tell us. So **PLEASE** tell us! Or better still, come and join us (contact details and future meetings below). When the plan is ready, everybody will be asked to vote to say if they support it. A good turn-out and a resounding “yes” is pretty important, so please make sure your views are represented. If you'd like us to come and talk to /listen to your group, let us know too. We don't want anyone to be missed out (including our youngest neighbours. So children - we **really** want to hear from you!).

**How will I know what's happening?** We want to make sure that we keep everyone up to date as much as we possibly can. So check the Parish

Council Notice board, outside the Post Office, or check the village website, where we're setting up a page. We'll try to put updates here, in the Wrayly Mail each month too.

This month we will be focusing on finalising the Plan's area boundary, agreeing the community survey format and the arrangements/dates for running it; setting out a draft vision and objectives and then asking for your views on them.

It's our neighbourhood, so let's shape it together.

### **Mobile Library Service to Wray**

A three weekly mobile Library service to the village of Wray is provided by Lancashire County Council using a specially constructed vehicle. The big white and red van with its blue stripes can be seen on Wednesdays in Wray. Step on board and use the integrated lift and you'll find a busy scene with people choosing their three weekly selection from over 1000 books, both fiction and non-fiction including local history. In addition there is a large selection of DVDs, Talking books on CD and some jigsaws. For the younger reader the van has board books for babies, lovely picture books for toddlers, as well as easy reading books for the emerging readers. There are books for older children. If the van hasn't a particular book you are looking for, then Gerry the mobile librarian will order it for you at a cost of just 60p per item. The library service can also deliver sets of books for reading groups, just go on the library website [www.lancashire.gov.uk/libraries](http://www.lancashire.gov.uk/libraries) to register your group and order you books from the extensive catalogue.

The children can try Lancashire's own reading challenge: the **Lancashire Reading Trail** which runs throughout the year. The children have to read

50 books; on the way they collect stickers, character cards, certificates of progress and a prize at the end. The children also learn a bit about the county they live in and have activities to try.

The stops in the village are at Wray Corner/Bridge End from 10.00 a.m. to 10.15 a.m. and outside the village Institute between 2.15 p.m. & 2.55 p.m.

The van also calls at other stops outside the village; Millhouses 10.20am, Ridges, 10.30 a.m. on its way to Tatham Fells School and Lowgill Village. The schedule of visits for 2014 will be: September 10th, October 1st & 22nd, November - No visit on the 12th due to van off the road for MOT. December 3rd & no visit on the 24th due to Christmas holidays.

### **Wray Village Life - October 1914**

Life continued as normal, the annual Harvest thanksgiving services went ahead, and the Mothers Union enjoyed a local branches get-together in Lancaster. A new church organist was appointed (Miss Illidge of Hornby), and the stand-in, Mr. Chadderton, was a guest at a farewell gathering where he was “greatly thanked”. Three Wray school scholars were examined for an Exhibition by Mr. Fisher, headmaster at Arkholme school. Subsequently Edward Maurice Davies and James Leslie Woodhouse were admitted to Lancaster Grammar School. Each boy received an Exhibition of £15 per annum.

Back to the war. The village received a letter from Lieut. Colonel Thorne of the King's Own Regiment with thanks for 145 pairs of socks (of such good quality) laces and handkerchiefs. These items were much appreciated by his men.

Weather - 13 days of rain at a depth of 1.96 inches.
